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## Help Your Car Keep Its Value

Buying a car is an investment, giving you and your family independence and freedom. But, conversely, it's a depreciative asset, meaning cars lose value from the moment you drive out of the dealer's parking lot.

However, there are some tips and tricks to help your car keep its value so when it comes time to upgrade, you'll still have some bargaining power:

- **Buy a reliable car:** cars like Subarus and Toyotas hold more value over time. That's because they tend to be more reliable, are more fuel efficient, have more safety features, and boast low maintenance costs. Be sure to do your research before making a purchase. Websites like Kelley Blue Book ([www.kbb.com](http://www.kbb.com)) and Edmunds ([www.edmunds.com](http://www.edmunds.com)) will provide good comparison information.
- **Keep up appearances:** wash and wax your car regularly to maintain the paint work and prevent scratches. Keep the interior clean by vacuuming and removing any stains from the upholstery and changing your oil regularly. A well-maintained car will also command a higher asking price.
- **Keep records:** always keep receipts from repairs, and maintain service logs, so that the buyer has a full history of the car. Check your CARFAX report to see what's on record about your car before you sell ([www.carfax.com/vehicle-history-reports](http://www.carfax.com/vehicle-history-reports)).
- **Avoid odors:** allowing pets in the car is going to eventually make the car smell, especially if they get in while wet. Ensure you keep smells to a minimum by toweling off dogs before they get in the car and using seat protectors or cargo liners where your dogs travel.
- **Maintain tires:** follow the manufacturer's instructions to maintain the correct air pressure in your tires, have them rotated regularly to ensure even wear, and be mindful of the tread when selling the car. You may want to buy new tires before selling, as a potential buyer will feel like they're saving money and be more likely to pay your asking price.

# Foods to Avoid before Flying

While going on vacation may signal the opportunity to eat foods you wouldn't normally, there are certain foods you might want to avoid while flying. That's because flying can already make you feel bloated and it may impair digestion. Similarly, there are some foods that support your body while travelling.

- **Try to avoid** fried or spicy foods which can cause indigestion; cruciferous vegetables (like broccoli or cabbage), beans, and apples which can make you gassy; alcohol and caffeine which are dehydrating and can lead to headaches and nausea; and airplane snacks which are often high in sodium
- **Foods/drinks to fill up on** bananas, which provide energy and may help to relieve any muscle cramps; lots of filtered water, herbal teas, or coconut water that you can sip throughout the flight; smoothies; and roasted unsalted nuts.

**What to eat and drink when you land:** be sure to drink lots more water; try dark chocolate as the magnesium can relieve muscle aches; a light balanced meal, and green tea to keep you energized if you land during the day.

1. **Remember your position:** This company believes in you enough to  
have selected you from a pile of other candidates. Their job offer is  
a sign that they're investing in you, so use this as leverage to  
negotiate the right salary.
2. **Do your research:** find out what the market pays for your job in  
your area, with your expertise. An easy way to do this is through a  
salary calculator, like [www.salary.com](http://www.salary.com) or [www.indeed.com](http://www.indeed.com).
3. **Know your worth:** make a note of your level of expertise, unique  
skills, and qualifications that set you apart from the other candidates  
and show you'll be an asset to the company.
4. **Name your figure:** based on the data you've researched, and your  
unique skills set, decide on the ideal salary you'd like to be offered.  
In deciding that figure, it's best to have a range in mind, from the  
lowest salary you'd be willing to accept (and still be happy), and  
what you'd be *really* happy with.
5. **Sit tight:** remember that the hiring manager wants you, and in order  
to secure your employment they need to make the offer first. You  
just need to be prepared for the conversation.
6. **Look at the big picture:** as you know, compensation doesn't just  
include salary so be sure to ask what benefits come with the job, like  
health insurance, stock options, paid leave, etc.
7. **Evaluate the cost/benefit:** before rushing into a rash decision, be  
sure to fully evaluate the pros and cons of the new job, compared to
